EIACP PC –Hub, Arunachal Pradesh (erstwhile ENVIS ) was established on December 2015 with Director (Environment) Deptt. Of Environment, Forests & Climate Change Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh under the Sanction of Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change (MoEF&CC), Govt. of India.

The Hub is functioning under the overall administration of the Prl. Secy, Environment, Forests & Climate Change, Department, Government of Arunachal Pradesh. The day to day affairs of the center are being supervised and managed by the Director Environment & Climate Change, who is also the EIACP Coordinator.

### 3. GRID Maps 9x9 km prepared based on Environmental Parameter identified degraded land inside reserved forest in Arunachal Pradesh

The Ministry had given direction for identifying degraded patches under Reserve Forests in Arunachal Pradesh. The initiative in Arunachal Pradesh involves utilizing satellite data, specifically Digital Elevation Model (DEM) images from the Sentinel-II satellite, along with Forest Cover Data from the Forest Survey of India 2019. These data sets are being employed to identify and map degraded patches within Reserved Forests in Arunachal Pradesh.

for the purpose of this GRID mapping, three nos of Forests Divisions in Arunachal Pradesh has been taken namely :

1. Khelong Forest Division, HQ Bhalukpong
2. Likhablai Forest Division, HQ, Likhabali
3. Pasighat Forest Division, HQ, Pasighat

#### Methodology:

- 1) **Data Sources:** Digital Elevation Model (DEM) Image: This data provides elevation information, which is crucial for calculating slope angles. The Forest Survey of India 2019 provides detailed information about the forest cover across the region.
- 2) **Criteria for Identifying Degraded Patches:** Slope Angle: Patches with slopes less than 25 degrees are being targeted. This criterion helps in identifying areas suitable for plantation and restoration efforts. Size: Areas covering more than 25 hectares are being considered. Larger patches are likely to have a more significant impact on the overall forest ecosystem.
- 3) **Mapping Process:** The data is being processed and mapped onto a 9x9 km grid. This grid mapping allows for a systematic and detailed analysis of the forest landscape, aiding in the identification and delineation of degraded patches.
- 4) **Conservation Efforts:** The initiative aims to the conservation of biodiversity, including flagship species like the Bengal Tiger.
- 5) **Statewide Perspective:** The initiative is part of a broader strategy to address forest degradation across the state of Arunachal Pradesh. With a significant portion of the state's area classified as degraded, such mapping efforts are crucial for planning and implementing effective conservation and restoration measures.
- 6) **Utility of Maps:** The mapped data will be valuable for various stakeholders, including Forest Officers, Researchers, Ecologists, and Planners. It provides essential information for decision-making processes related to forest management, conservation planning, and ecological research.
- 7) **Overall,** the integration of satellite data, forest cover information, and targeted conservation efforts reflects a proactive approach towards addressing forest degradation and promoting sustainable management of forest resources in Arunachal Pradesh.





## 3.1 Khellong Forest Division

Arunachal Pradesh has total of 48 Forest Divisions with 15 of them being wildlife division. Khellong Forest Division lies under Bichom District carved out of West Kameng and East Kameng district of Arunachal Pradesh.

Khellong Forest Division is situated in the northeastern part of India, within the state of Arunachal Pradesh. It is located in the eastern Himalayan region, characterized by rugged terrain, dense forests, and diverse ecosystems.

The division is renowned for its exceptional biodiversity, harboring a wide range of flora and fauna. It is estimated to house approximately 300 species of birds, making it a haven for birdwatchers and ornithologists. Additionally, Khellong Forest Division boasts around 1500 vascular plant species, highlighting its botanical richness and ecological importance.

The forest ecosystems within Khellong Forest Division play crucial roles in maintaining regional ecological balance and supporting various ecosystem services. These forests contribute to carbon sequestration, soil conservation, watershed protection, and climate regulation. The presence of diverse habitats, including tropical forests, montane forests, and alpine meadows, enhances the ecological resilience of the region and provides habitats for numerous species of wildlife.

Despite its ecological significance, Khellong Forest Division has faced threats from human activities, notably extensive logging and habitat fragmentation. These anthropogenic pressures have led to forest degradation and loss of biodiversity. Encroachment, illegal logging, and unsustainable resource extraction have further exacerbated the conservation challenges faced by the division.

Local communities residing in and around Khellong Forest Division have traditionally depended on forest resources for their livelihoods. These forest-dependent communities engage in activities such as hunting, gathering of non-timber forest products, and subsistence agriculture. Balancing conservation objectives with the socio-economic needs of local communities poses a complex challenge for forest management in the region.

Recognizing the importance of conserving Khellong Forest Division's biodiversity and ecosystem services, various conservation initiatives have been undertaken. These include protected area establishment, habitat restoration projects, community-based conservation programs, and sustainable livelihood initiatives. Efforts to address deforestation, promote sustainable forest management practices, and mitigate human-wildlife conflicts are integral components of conservation strategies in the division.

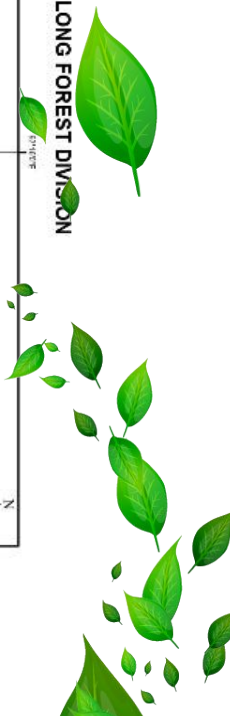
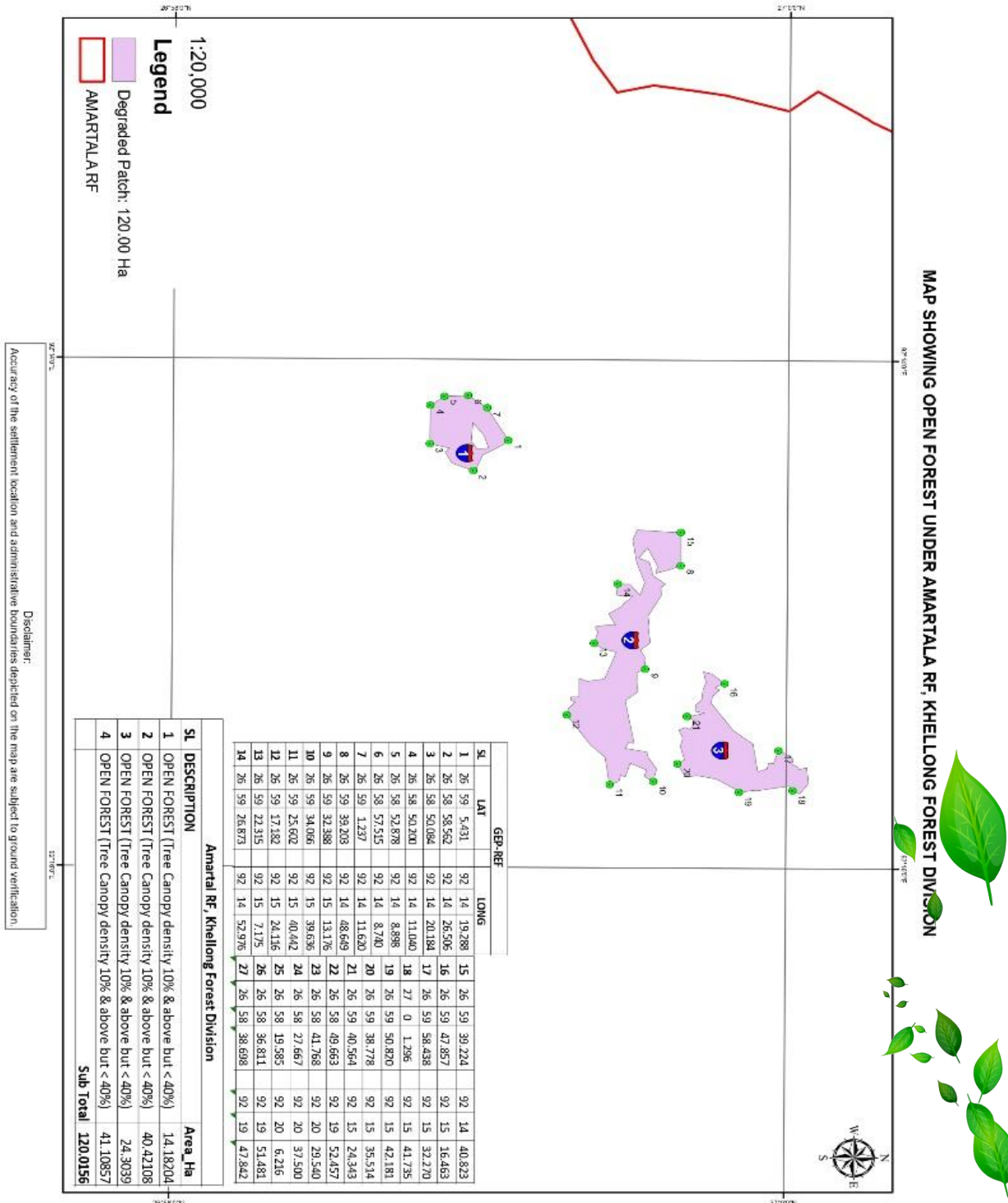
Khellong Forest Division serves as a vital corridor for wildlife movement and maintains connectivity between different forest habitats. This connectivity is crucial for ensuring genetic exchange, population viability, and the long-term survival of species, including flagship species like the Bengal Tiger. In summary, Khellong Forest Division stands as a biodiversity hotspot in Arunachal Pradesh, characterized by its rich birdlife, diverse flora, and ecological significance. Despite facing conservation challenges, concerted efforts are being made to protect and sustainably manage its forest resources for the benefit of both biodiversity and local communities.





### 3.2 Degraded Maps identified under Amartala Reserve Forest,, Pasighat Forest Division,

The state encompasses a total geographical area of 83,743 square kilometers, of which 15,036 square kilometers are degraded (17.95%). Within the Amartala Reserve Forest, Khellong Forest Division, there is a degraded area of 1.200156 square kilometers, accounting for 0.0080% of the total degraded area, which amounts to 17.95%.





### 3.3. Dipa Reserve Forest (Kane WLS) under Likabali Forest Division

Kane Wildlife Sanctuary is a protected area situated in the West Siang district of Arunachal Pradesh. It is nestled amidst the Eastern Himalayas, a region known for its rich biodiversity and rugged landscapes. The sanctuary is located at a strategic juncture between the Himalayan foothills and the plains of Assam, contributing to its ecological significance and biodiversity.

The sanctuary covers a considerable area, encompassing diverse habitats ranging from tropical forests to alpine meadows. Its altitude varies significantly, ranging from lower elevations to higher mountainous regions. The terrain within Kane Wildlife Sanctuary is characterized by steep slopes, deep valleys, fast-flowing rivers, and dense vegetation, creating a mosaic of ecosystems that support a wide variety of flora and fauna.

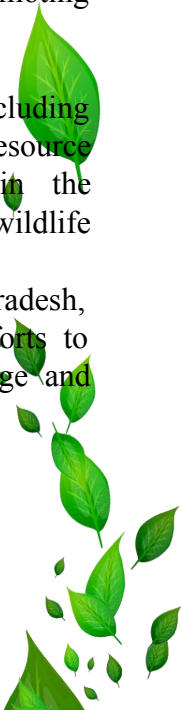
Kane Wildlife Sanctuary is renowned for its rich biodiversity, hosting a diverse array of plant and animal species. The sanctuary is home to numerous mammal species, including several endemic and endangered species. Key mammalian species found within the sanctuary include the Red Panda (*Ailurus fulgens*), Himalayan Black Bear (*Ursus thibetanus*), Asiatic Black Bear (*Ursus arctos*), and various species of deer, langur monkeys, and wild boar. The avifauna of Kane Wildlife Sanctuary is also notable, with numerous bird species inhabiting its forests, including several species of pheasants, hornbills, and woodpeckers.

Kane Wildlife Sanctuary holds the status of a protected area under the wildlife protection laws of India. As a designated wildlife sanctuary, it is managed and protected by the forest department of the Arunachal Pradesh government. Conservation efforts within the sanctuary focus on habitat protection, wildlife monitoring, anti-poaching measures, community engagement, and sustainable ecotourism development. The sanctuary serves as a critical habitat for the conservation of endangered and endemic species, contributing to regional biodiversity conservation efforts.

Kane Wildlife Sanctuary offers opportunities for nature-based tourism and wildlife viewing. Visitors can explore the sanctuary through guided treks, nature walks, and birdwatching excursions. Basic visitor facilities such as forest rest houses, campsites, and interpretation centers may be available within or near the sanctuary, enhancing the visitor experience while promoting conservation awareness.

Despite its protected status, Kane Wildlife Sanctuary faces various conservation threats, including habitat loss, human-wildlife conflict, illegal hunting, and unsustainable resource extraction. Encroachment, infrastructure development, and agricultural expansion in the surrounding areas pose additional challenges to the sanctuary's ecological integrity and wildlife habitat.

In summary, Kane Wildlife Sanctuary represents a vital conservation area in Arunachal Pradesh, characterized by its diverse ecosystems, rich biodiversity, and scenic landscapes. Efforts to protect and manage the sanctuary are essential for safeguarding its ecological heritage and ensuring the long-term survival of its flora and fauna.

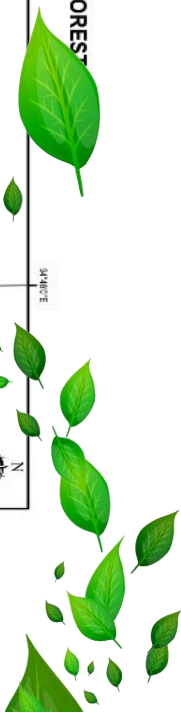
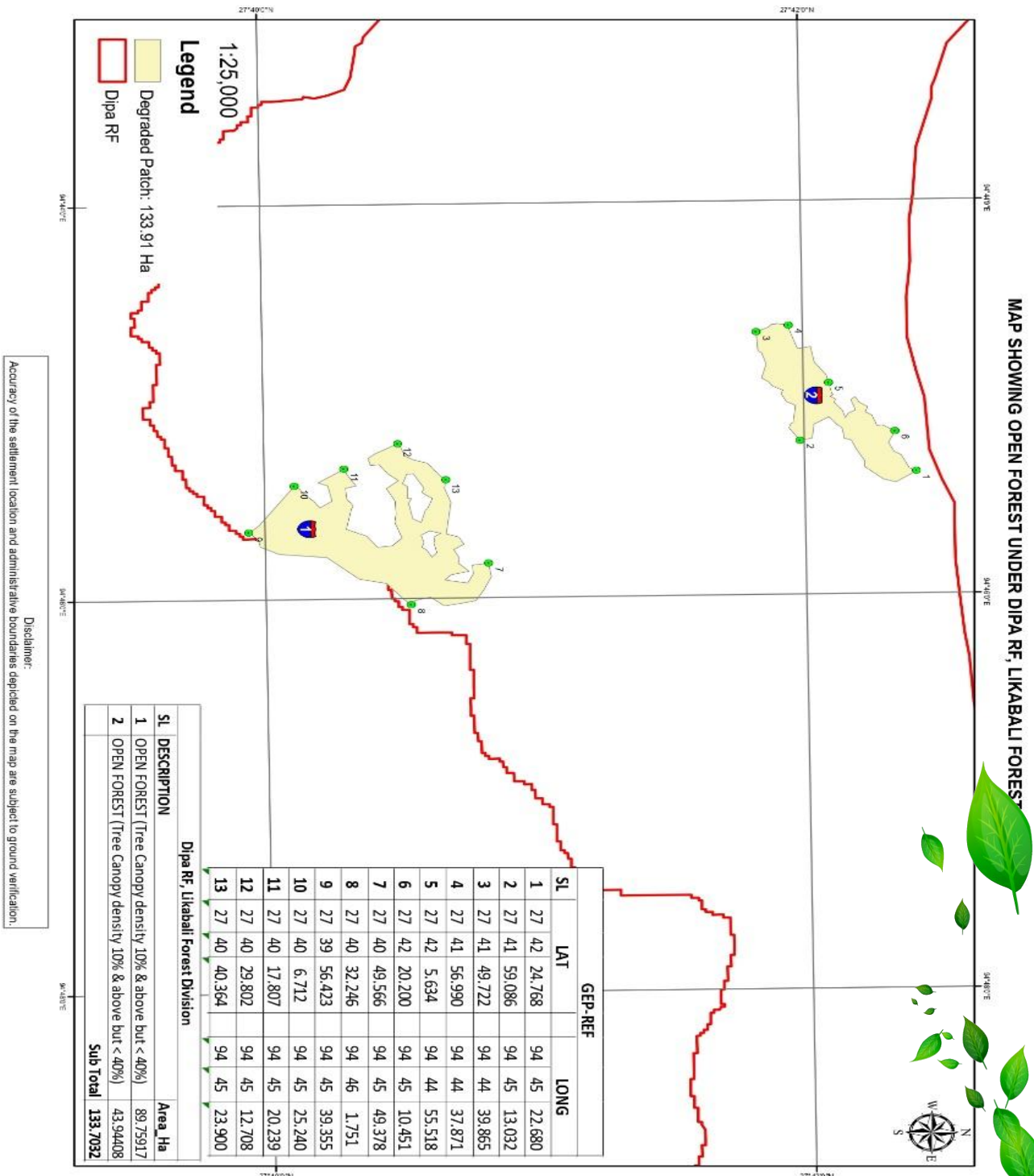






### 3.4. Degraded Maps identified under Dipa Reserve Forest, Likabali Forest Division:

The state encompasses a total geographical area of 83,743 square kilometers, of which 15,036 square kilometers are degraded (17.95%). Within the Dipa Reserve Forest, Likabali Forest Division, there is a degraded area of 1.3391 square kilometers, accounting for 0.0100% of the total degraded area, which amounts to 17.95%.





### 3.5. Poba Reserve Forest (D`Ering WLS), Pasighat Forest Division

Poba Reserve Forest is located under the Pasighat Forest Division of Arunachal Pradesh. It shares a contiguous landscape with Daying Ering Wildlife Sanctuary in Arunachal Pradesh and Dibru Saikhowa National Park in Upper Assam's Tinsukia district, given its ecological significance as a wildlife corridor.

Degraded patches within the D. Ering Wildlife Sanctuary near Pasighat, Arunachal Pradesh, could be a result of various factors, including human activities and natural processes. Here are some common causes and potential solutions:

1. **Deforestation and Habitat Loss:** Illegal logging, encroachment for agriculture, and infrastructure development can lead to deforestation and habitat loss within the sanctuary. Efforts to combat deforestation may include stricter enforcement of forest protection laws, community involvement in conservation efforts, and reforestation initiatives to restore degraded areas.
2. **Poaching and Wildlife Disturbance:** Poaching and illegal wildlife trade can lead to the depletion of wildlife populations within the sanctuary. Strengthening anti-poaching measures, increasing surveillance and patrols, and raising awareness about the importance of wildlife conservation can help mitigate this threat.
3. **Invasive Species:** The introduction of invasive plant species can disrupt native ecosystems and outcompete native vegetation, leading to habitat degradation. Control measures such as manual removal of invasive species and restoration of native vegetation can help restore degraded habitats.
4. **Soil Erosion and Land Degradation:** Unsustainable land use practices, such as overgrazing and improper agricultural practices, can contribute to soil erosion and land degradation within the sanctuary. Implementing sustainable land management practices, such as contour farming, terracing, and agroforestry, can help prevent soil erosion and improve soil health.
5. **Climate Change:** Climate change can exacerbate habitat degradation and impact wildlife populations through changes in temperature, precipitation patterns, and habitat suitability. Implementing climate adaptation strategies such as habitat restoration and creating wildlife corridors to facilitate species movement, can help mitigate the impacts of climate change on the sanctuary's ecosystems.

Addressing degraded patches within the D. Ering Wildlife Sanctuary requires a multi-faceted approach involving collaboration between government agencies, local communities, and conservation organizations to address the underlying causes of degradation and implement effective conservation and restoration measures.

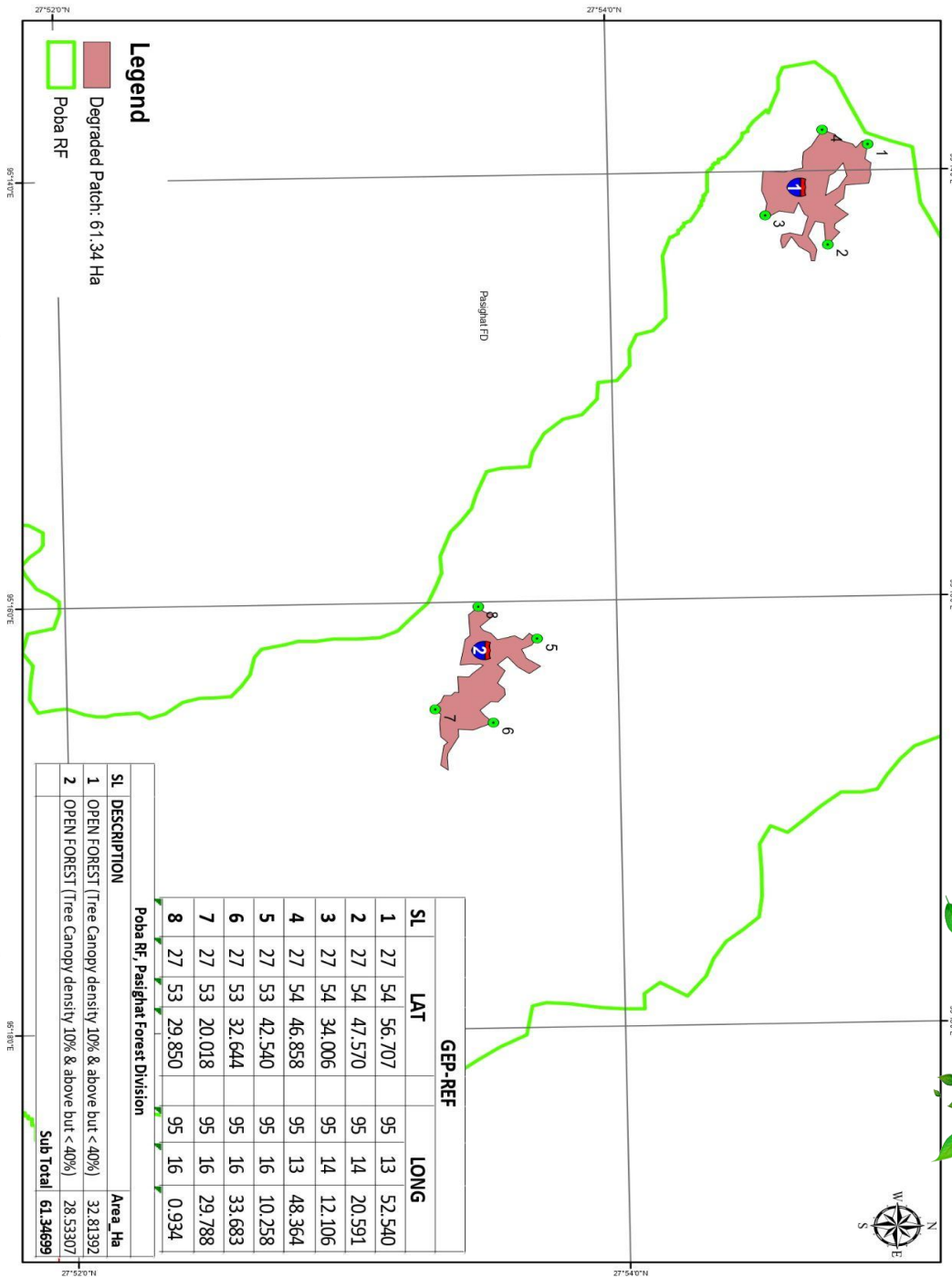




### 3.6. Degraded Maps identified under Poba Reserve Forest, Pasighat Forest Division,

MAP SHOWING OPEN FOREST UNDER POBA RF, PASIGHAT FOREST DIVISION

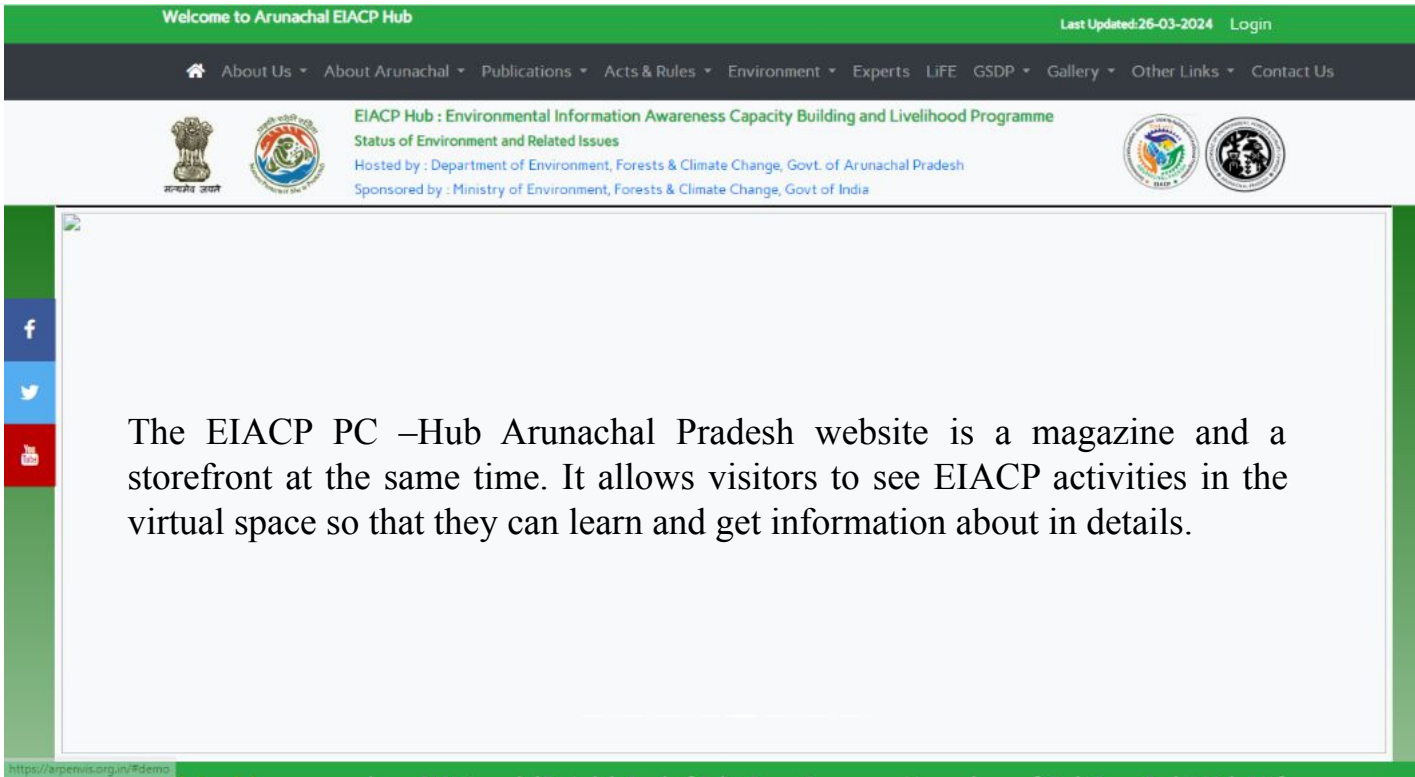

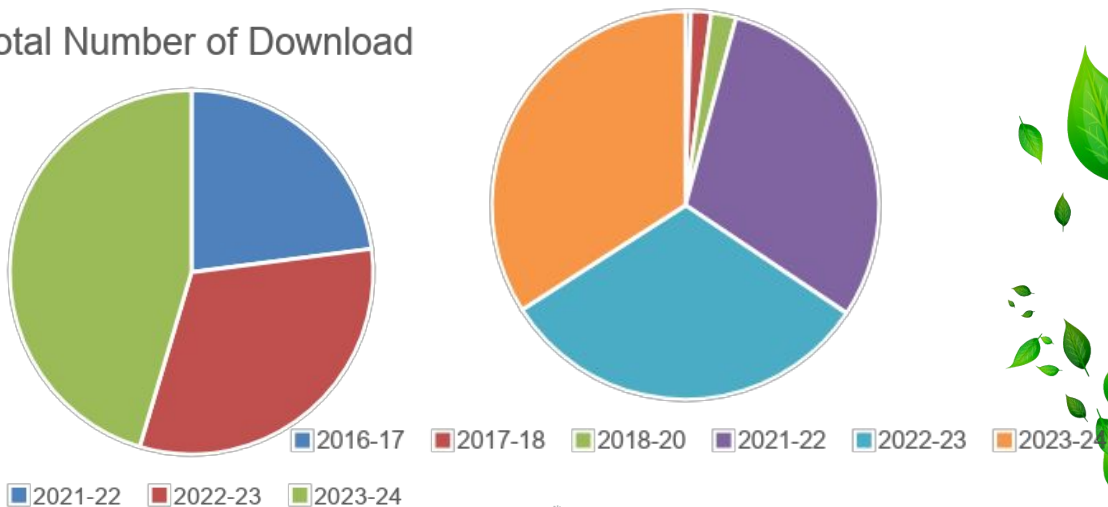

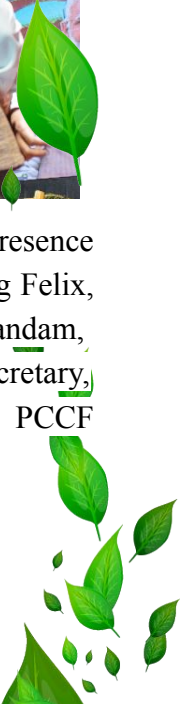

## 5.6. Celebration of World Wetland Day

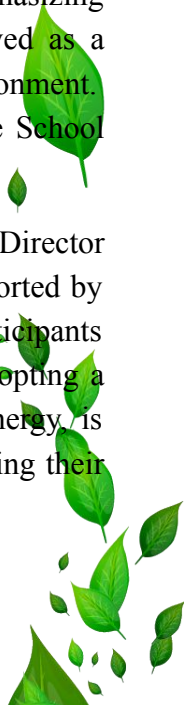

**What are wetlands?**  
Wetlands are ecosystems saturated with water, either seasonally or permanently. They include mangroves, marshes, rivers, lakes, deltas, floodplains, and flooded forests, rice fields, coral reefs, marine areas no deeper than 6 meters at low tide, as well as human-made wetlands such as waste-water treatment ponds and reservoirs (Wetland (Conservation and Management) Rules, 2017).

**Wetlands of Arunachal Pradesh**  
Arunachal Pradesh is bestowed with a large number of Wetlands. These are important wetlands that harbor huge floral and faunal biodiversity and maintain the natural functioning of wetland ecosystems as a whole. Arunachal Pradesh has 2,653 wetlands in total (Space Application Centre (ISRO), 2009) with a total area of 1,55,728 ha.



- Dibang Valley has 443 Nos of HAWs followed by Lohit (204) and Tawang (204)






 On 16 September 2023, the World Customs Organization (WCO) joins with the international community in marking the **International Day for the Preservation of the Ozone Layer**, commonly known as World Ozone Day – an opportunity to acknowledge achievements, take stock of where we are, and highlight the ongoing work under the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer (Montreal Protocol).
